Itinerary

Day 1: (Tue) Aug 26 – Honolulu Depart Honolulu

→ Meet the Panda Travel representative at the airline's check-in counters 3 hours prior to departure.

Day 2: (Wed) Aug 27 – Haneda-Tokyo

Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Arrive at Haneda Airport and meet your English speaking guide at the arrival lobby. We will then transfer to Sunshine City Prince Hotel, our accommodation for 3 nights. Our hotel is directly connected to Sunshine City shopping center with many shopping and dining options available to you. Nearby, you'll also find a 24-hr Family Mart convenience store and a Seiyu supermarket for snack, bento, and beverage pickups. Enjoy your evening at leisure.

Day 3: (Thu) Aug 28 – Tokyo (B)

Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Breakfast at hotel.

 \rightarrow 8:30am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for Tokyo.

 \rightarrow 9:00am – Our morning begins at the iconic Tsukiji Outer Market. A renowned bucketlist spot, Tsukiji is the largest fish market in the world. While the inner auction market relocated to Toyosu in 2018, the charm remains in its outer market. Be sure to enjoy all that the outer market has to offer, from seasonal produce and candy tasting to knifemaking artisan shops.

→ 11:30am – We'll now visit teamLab Borderless at

Azabudai Hills. Using technology and perspective, this immersive museum takes visitors through labyrinth-like rooms to experience fields of flowers, rooms with walls that appear to be composed of brightly lit geographic shapes, and other mesmerizing digital art displays.

→ 2:00pm – Now a visit to a brand new landmark: Tokyo Plaza Harajuku, also known as Harakado. Opened in April 2024, this stylish 9-story shopping and entertainment complex in Harajuku features striking architectural design and hosts numerous trendy shops, cafes, and restaurants. A highlight is the rooftop garden terrace, offering stunning city views and a hotspot for photos.

→ 4:00pm – Return to hotel. Enjoy the evening of shopping and dining on your own.

Day 4: (Fri) Aug 29 – Tokyo-Free day at leisure (B) Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

→ After breakfast, enjoy your free day to explore Tokyo!

→ If you've already experienced Sunshine City shopping mall, take a visit to Ikebukuro station and hop on a rail line that will connect you to other popular areas like Shinagawa, Shibuya, Shinjuku, Ueno, and Akihabara. Ikebukuro station is also close to our hotel.

Day 5: (Sat) Aug 30 – Tokyo-Kawasaki-Yokohama (B) JR East Hotel Mets Premier Yokohama Sakuragicho (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Breakfast at hotel.

\rightarrow 9:00am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for Yokohama.

→ 9:45am – Our day begins at Kawasaki Daishi Temple. Founded in 1128, this tranquil sanctuary is dedicated to the revered deity Kobo Daishi, a pivotal figure in Japanese Buddhism known to ward off evil. The temple features a rich history, exquisite architecture, and a serene ambiance. Later, stroll through the nearby shopping streets to explore traditional snacks and souvenirs.

→ 11:45am – Calling all ramen lovers! Time for a visit to the world's first ramen themed amusement park: Shin-Yokohama Ramen Museum. Here, you'll find a replica of 1950s Tokyo with retro ramen shops, each featuring ramen specialities from a different region in Japan. You'll also come across exciting displays showcasing the history of this famous noodle dish and its journey to national and international stardom. Enjoy this delicious culinary adventure!

 \rightarrow 2:00pm – Here we are at the Yokohama Bay Quarter. This vibrant hub of culture, food, shops and entertainment along the picturesque waterfront is a must-visit for anyone in the Yokohama area.

→ 4:10pm – Step aboard the Sea Bass water bus and let the gentle currents guide you through the bustling cityscape. On this leisurely sightseeing ride, admire landmarks like the iconic Yokohama Marine Tower, Hammerhead, and the Red Brick Warehouse. Relax and enjoy Yokohama through its waterways.

→ 5:00pm – Arrive at JR East Hotel Mets Premier Yokohama Sakuragicho. Our hotel is located just a short walk from JR Sakuragicho Station, providing easy access to shopping areas and an array of nearby restaurants.

Day 6: (Sun) Aug 31 – Yokohama (B)

JR East Hotel Mets Premier Yokohama Sakuragicho (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Breakfast at hotel.

 \rightarrow 8:30am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for Yokohama.

→ 9:00am – Our morning begins at the energetic Yokohama Nanbu Market. Here, explore a variety of fresh seafood, seasonal produce, and confections from local vendors. Enjoy this fantastic cultural hub, where locals and visitors come together to experience the flavors of Kanagawa.

→ 10:30am – Now a visit to the Japanese Overseas

Migration Museum. Dedicated to late 19th and early 20th century Japanese emigrants, the museum highlights the contributions they've made to places around the world-including Hawai'i!

→ 11:45am – Established in 1859, Yokohama Chinatown is the largest Chinatown in Japan. This bustling neighborhood is a culturally rich destination that offers something for everyone. Whether you're indulging in delicious cuisine, exploring historical sites, or shopping for unique souvenirs, you can count on having an unforgettable experience here.

→ 2:00pm – Onto our next adventure: a ride on the Yokohama Air Cabin to enjoy breathtaking panoramic views of Yokohama Bay, the Minato Mirai skyline, and, on clear days, even Mount Fuji. This is the perfect opportunity for photography enthusiasts to capture the city's beauty from above!

 \rightarrow **3:00pm** – Return to hotel. Enjoy the rest of the day at leisure!

Day 7: (Mon) Sept 1 – Yokohama-Kamakura-Haneda-Honolulu (B)

→ Breakfast at hotel.

\rightarrow 9:00am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for Kamakura.

→ 10:15am – We start our day with a visit to Enoshima, a charming island packed with attractions and situated at the mouth of the Sakai River. After crossing the Enoshima Oohashi Bridge to reach Enoshima-jinja Shrine, you'll be greeted by marine product shops, souvenir stores, inns, and traditional restaurants.

→ 12:15pm – Next, a visit to the Great Buddha at Kotokuin Temple. This mountainous bronze Amida Buddha stands nearly 38 feet tall, making it the 2nd tallest bronze Buddha in Japan. Despite being exposed in the open air since 1495, the statue remains beautifully adorned and well-preserved. For a small donation, visitors can enter the Buddha and experience what many regard as Japan's National Treasure. → 1:45pm – Afterwards, explore the lively Komachi-dori shopping street and grab lunch on your own. Be sure to stop by Kamakura's famous cookie store for a sample. They're best known for their dove-shaped butter cookies, which make for a great Kamakura souvenir and omiyage gift. Enjoy some last-minute shopping!

→ Transfer to Haneda Airport to begin our check-in process for the flight home.

→ Arrive in Honolulu (same day).
